Sampling method is the method of gathering information about all members of the population (known as a population) which is the set of all individuals under concern. The advantage of this method is that it is easy to find out statistical feedback about the behavior of your business, all the statistics of your business can be taken a part of the population for your choice.

It is a more reliable, quick, and usually easier to compare information and records about all individuals. It can collect the information for knowing all individuals in the country using the census method. In our country, the Government collects the behavior of people under the census. The census method collects information from households regarding their economic, the economic condition, the total number of employees, members of the family, etc. This method must take into account all the units. It cannot leave out anyone in collecting data. Once collected, the Census of India records demographic information such as birth rate, death rate, total population, population growth rate, etc. The last census was conducted in the year 2011.

Conclusion:

As we have studied, the statistical surveys only take some specific characteristics of the data in which they are grouped together by the study. In the case of the Census of 2011, for example, the census characteristics take that all units are taken into account. But it is not always possible to collect information from all the units in the population.

It is a time-consuming and costly method. Thus, in many cases, we would like to collect information from some representative group from the population and then make appropriate inferences. This representative group which contains some units from the whole population is called the sample.

The Difference Between Census and Sampling

The statistical difference between census and sampling are discussed in detail in the given below points:

1. The census is a statistical method that collects and records the data about the members of the population. The sampling is different as the nature of the population pointed is to represent the entire group in all the characteristics.
2. The census is extremely costly as it requires substantial resources to collect, recording, and other issues as a partial information study method. In the census, each and every unit of population is researched. In the sampling, only a fraction of data is selected from the population for research.

4. Census is a very time-consuming method of survey whereas, in the case of sampling, the survey does not take much time.

5. The census method requires high degree involvement as it involves the research and collection of all the units of the population. Little sampling which is a comparatively economical method.

6. These results must be considered as accurate and reliable as the units are selected at random in the results drawn from the sample.

7. The size of the sample determines the probability of error in the survey, i.e., the larger the size of population the less are the chances of error and the smaller the size, the higher are the chances of error. This is not possible with census as all the units are taken into consideration.

8. Census is best suited for the population of heterogeneous nature. As opposed to sampling which is appropriate for homogeneous nature.

Conclusion

- **Conclusion:**
- Many people confused census as the opposite of sampling, in which all the members of the population are taken into account instead of only a fraction. But the census is based on the sampling being in accurate collection. Therefore, it is quite clear that there are significant differences and advantages are different, but it can't be said that one is above the other.
