## Rights and Duties

### • Introduction:

#### → Meaning of Right:

Right in the ordinary sense of the term means a number of things, but it is generally taken to mean the standard of permitted action within a certain sphere. As a legal term, it means the standard permitted action by law. Such permitted actions of a person is known as his legal right.

A legal right must be distinguished from a moral or natural right. A legal right is an interest recognized and protected by a rule of legal justice, an interest in the violation of which would interest it is, and respect for which is a legal duty. Moral or natural right means an interest recognized and protected by a rule of natural justice, an interest the violation of which would be a moral wrong, and respect for which is a moral duty.

#### → Definition of Right:

About the definition and the analysis of the legal rights there is a great deal of difference of opinion among the jurists.

1. Austin: According to Austin, right is a faculty which resides in a determinate party or parties by virtue of a given law and which avails against a party or parties other than the party or parties in whom it resides. According to him, a person can be said to have a right only when another or others are bound or obligated by law to do something or forbear in regard to him. It means that a right has always a corresponding duty.

Court Visit (20 Marks), Chamber Visit (20 marks) and visit to other Institutions (10 Marks)

### **Court Visit**

The student shall attend two trials, one civil and one criminal. They shall maintain a record and enter the various steps such as:-

1. Nature of the case/suit/challan/complaint;
2. Stage of the case/suit/issues/charges;
3. Proceedings on the date of the visit.
4. Relationship observed of Bar-Bench-Client;
5. Court room atmosphere.

The students shall record their observations during their visit to the court. The diary shall be signed by the Advocate concerned on panel of the Department and the teacher Incharge of the group. The students shall be evaluated for 20 marks for Court visit by the teacher Incharge.

### **Chamber Visit**

Each student shall observe at least two interviewing sessions of clients at the

Lawyer's chamber and record the proceedings in a diary. The students shall further observe the preparation of documents and court papers by the advocate and the procedure for the filing in atleast two suits/petitions. This shall be recorded in the diary which shall be signed by the Advocate concerned on panel of the Department and the teacher Incharge of the group. The teacher Incharge shall evaluate the same for 20 marks.

### **Visit to Other Institutions:**

Lok Adalat/Jail/Police station/Detention Centre/Village Panchayat

The students shall prepare a Report noting his observations about the institutions visited. The teacher In charge shall brief the students before the visit. This shall carry 10 marks

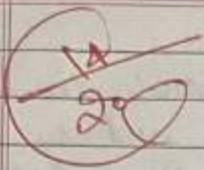

2. A-1 works in private sector. At the insistence of his parents she got married with Deceased on December 9, 2015. They started living with the parents of A-1 in Agharam. When the Deceased, was 6 months pregnant, she was forcefully sent back to her parental house. Deceased somehow managed to return to her parental home and later on she had a baby girl. As the year passed, the demand continued and was accompanied by physical and mental harassment.
3. On 08/07/2019, few of the neighbours rushed into Sanjeev's house on hearing the commotion and outcry. By seeing the condition of Alya, neighbours helped Sanjeev to admit his wife to hospital. Subsequently her condition worsened and doctors announced that there was no hope for her survival, thereafter, in her Dying Declaration given to judicial magistrate, Alya told that she was physically abused, made to starve and was fed only soaked rice and sugared water for bare survival.
4. First Information Report was registered against husband of deceased and her in-laws under section 302, section 304B and section 498A of Dravidian Penal Code, 1860 and Section 4 of The Dowry Prohibition Act, 1961. The police conducted investigation and recorded statements of several persons acquainted with the facts and circumstances. On completion of investigation, Investigation Officer forwarded final report to the jurisdictional Magistrate Court. The court took cognizance; served copies of the final report along with statements and other documents.
