DOCUMENTS REQUIRED TO BE SUBMITTED ALONGWITH THE APPLICATION FORM

1. Two photo copies (duly attested) of Matric Diploma

Courses

- 2. Two photo copies (duly attested) of BA/B.Sc./B.Com or equivalent examination passed (Degree or Provisional certificate).
- 3. Two photo copies (duly attested) of marks card of lst, 2nd & 3rd year degree examination.
- 4. Two photo copies (duly attested) of State Subject (For J&K domicile only).
- 5. Two photo copies (duly attested) of category certificate (For candidates seeking admission under any reserved category)

DOCUMENTS REQUIRED TO BE SUBMITTED AT THE TIME OF ADMISSION

- 1. All the original documents from serial number 1 to 5 as stated above.
- Original discharge certificate from the institution last attended alongwith two photo copies of the same duly attested. No candidate will be admitted in absence of this certificate.
- 3. Migration certificate in original alongwith two photo copies duly attested (For candidates other than Jammu University).
- 4. An affidavit for the gap period (education gap) if any (Applicable to those candidates who have passed their qualifying examination before the current session i.e. one year earlier or so and have not taken admission in any other course). Specimen attached at Appendix 'A'
- 5. An affidavit to the effect that the category certificate is genuine. (in case admission is granted under any reserved category)
- Eligibility Form: (students coming from other universities shall fill up the eligibility form of this University and submit the same to the College alongwith prescribed University fee)
- Eight recent passport size coloured photographs.

CANCELLATION OF ADMISSION

The Admission Committee shall have the right to cancel the admission of any student who fails to produce the requisite documents/fees within the prescribed time after admission.

TERM PROMOTION

Promotion shall be regulated as per Jammu University Statutes as amended for time to time.

- a) No student shall be promoted from the first to the second, second to the third, third to the fourth, fourth to the fifth and fifth to the sixth term unless he-
- i) fulfils the statutory requirements of attendance; and
- ii) takes the term examination in all the courses of study prescribed for the term;
- Provided that a candidate, who has been unable to appear in or complete the examination on account of illness or circumstances beyond his control, may on the recommendation of the Dean, Faculty of Law, and with the approval of the Vice-Chancellor be promoted to the next higher term and allowed to appear in the paper/papers in which he has been unable to appear:
- Provided further that the application of such a candidate shall not be entertained unless it satisfies the following conditions :
- i) It reaches the Controller of Examination not later than the tenth day from the date on which the candidate was incapacitated from taking or completing the examination.
- ii) It is accompanied by a medical certificate issued by a Civil Surgeon/registered medical practitioner incase of illness or documentary proof in the case of absence due to circumstances beyond the control of the candidate.
- Promotion from the first to the second, second to the third, third to the fourth, fourth to the fifth and fifth to the sixth semesters may be allowed to a student even if he fails to qualify in the paper/s prescribed for the respective term examination:
- Provided that every student shall qualify in all the papers prescribed for the first and second or third and fourth, fifth & sixth terms within five years of joining the first term or third term or fifth term, as the case may be, failing which his examination shall stand cancelled and he shall neither be allowed to continue Law course as a regular student nor to appear in any examination privately.

STANDARD OF PASSING

It shall be regulated by the Jammu University statutes as amended from time to time.

In order to qualify for the Degree of Bachelor of Laws a candidate shall obtain not less than 40% marks in each paper :

Provided that a candidate, who fails in one or more papers at a term examination, shall be allowed grace marks upto 1% of the total marks prescribed for a term examination.

Provided further that the Vice-Chancellor may award one grace mark to a candidate who after getting the benefit of grace marks mentioned in the foregoing provisio, fails by one mark -

- a) to qualify in all the papers prescribed for the first or second term examination; and/or
- b) to qualify in all the papers prescribed for the third or fourth term examination.
- c) To qualify in all the papers prescribed for the fifth or sixth term examination.

NOTE:-

UNIT TESTS

A Unit Test is held in all subjects in each semester after the completion of each unit of the prescribed course. The test is held in the period of concerned subject without disturbing the teaching schedule of the other subjects. On the completion of the course a house test is also held in each subject/paper of the prescribed course.

NO MIGRATION

A student admitted to 3 Year LL.B (Professional) Course in any of the affiliated college shall not be permitted to have migration, while pursuing the course, to the Deptt. of Law University of Jammu and vice versa.
