stressed that law is never static and is ever evolving. While discussing the ambit and scope of Consumer Protection Act, Adv. Sawhney explained the applicability of Environment Protection Act, 1986 and its scope in the Consumer Protection Act. To make the session more interactive, Adv. He stressed that consumer law is a developmental part of practice and how the setting up of consumer tribunals have come up across the country. He dwelt upon the intricacies of Consumer Protection Act like maintainability of the complaint, tortious liability, injunction, class action suits etc. He

explained the setting up of Central Consumer Protection Authority under the new legislation and how the provisions under Consumer Protection Act, 2019 have given the powers of a judicial Magistrate.



